## May Program Meeting: Dr. Richard Carrier

This month, **Dr. Richard Carrier** will speak on his new book *Not the Impossible Faith: Why Christianity Didn't Need a Miracle to Succeed*, which demolishes the arguments and bluster of Internet hack apologist "J.P. Holding."

Richard describes his talk as "an amusing tour of [his] latest book, which exposes the lousy scholarship and probable dishonesty of the infamous online Christian apologist J.P. Holding. In the process, you'll learn all kinds of useful and interesting things about the ancient world and the earliest Christians, and why their religion was a natural success -- all contradicting Holding's book, *The Impossible Faith*, which argued Christianity was so badly conceived it could never have succeeded unless it had irrefutable proof that Jesus had risen from the dead. Poppycock!"

Richard Carrier is widely known for his scholarship on Christianity and the societies that spawned it. We are certain you will enjoy this talk. And Richard's new book, on which the talk is based, will be on sale after the discussion.

## **East Bay Atheists Meeting**




This month, Dr. Eric Maisel will speak on his new book, The Atheist's

Way.

The Atheist's Way answers the question, "How can a person make meaning in a universe that cares nothing about meaning?" It is at once an atheist lifestyle guide and a handbook on the practice of making and maintaining personal meaning.

In it, we hear from former believers who have made the journey from belief to atheism, survey thousands of years of atheist traditions, reestablish the primary role of personal responsibility in the realms of ethics and meaning, examine the rewards and challenges of atheism, and discover what is required of each of us if we are to live well without gods.



Dr. Eric Maisel is the author of more than thirty books on a variety of subjects, among them atheism, creativity, depression, anxiety, and addiction.

Dr. Maisel founded the field of creativity coaching and is widely regarded as America's foremost creativity coach. He trains creativity coaches, provides core trainings for the Creativity Coaching Association, and coaches creative and performing artists by telephone, by email and in workshop settings.

Dr. Maisel holds degrees in philosophy (B.S.), psychology (B.A.), creative writing (M.A.), counseling (M.S.), and counseling psychology (PhD). He is a California licensed marriage and family therapist, hosts two shows on the Personal Life Media Network, and writes a monthly "Coaching the Artist Within" column for Art Calendar Magazine.

Dr. Maisel's recent writings on the paradigm shift from seeking meaning to making meaning, on the existential roots of depression, anxiety, and addiction, and on the next steps in atheist living have gained him a wide audience. He invites you to join him in these investigations by participating in The Atheist's Way virtual book review tour, by listening to his shows on the Personal Life Media network, by visiting his creativity and atheism blogs, by discussing The Atheist's Way, by training with him as a meaning coach and by inviting him to speak.


